Mayor Hanson received the Johnson and Johnson vaccine Wednesday at Canaan Baptist Church. Thanks to Baptist Tipton and both Greater St. John and Canaan Baptist, we've had two successful vaccine drives separate from those being administered at Cobb-Parr Park. Beginning Saturday, April 10 and continuing every Saturday through July 1, the Johnson and Johnson vaccine will be administered in a parking lot drive-thru at the DSCC Jimmy Naifeh Center from 9AM – 2PM. Remember, J and J is a one shot only vaccine.

Just as a reminder, any Tennessean (age-restricted) is now eligible to be vaccinated. In the counties where the Pfizer vaccine is available, vaccinations will begin for anyone age 16 and older. If you prefer the Moderna vaccine, it is still available as well, but you must be 18 and older to receive it. The Tipton County Health Department is currently dispensing the Pfizer vaccine as of Monday 3/22/21. There are now options for any of the top three vaccines (Moderna, Pfizer, and Johnson & Johnson) in Tipton County. COVID-19 vaccinations also continue here at Cobb-Parr Park in Covington. 
