 - 3 non-certified officers were scheduled to attend TLETA (TN Law Enforcement Training Academy). One officer was exposed to COVID and has been rescheduled for March, one officer was dismissed due to academic failure and was terminated, and one officer is currently in week four of training
 - We began advertising for certified officers on social media and Indeed
 - On January 20, 2021 Lt. Jack Howell was promoted to Captain and will assume second in command and acting Chief in my absence

- On December 26, 2020, Sgt. Nelson was in an accident while en route to Region One Medical Center to follow up with a shooting victim. The other driver was found to be at fault. The vehicle was deemed totaled by our insurance company.

Register for a Vaccination Appointment

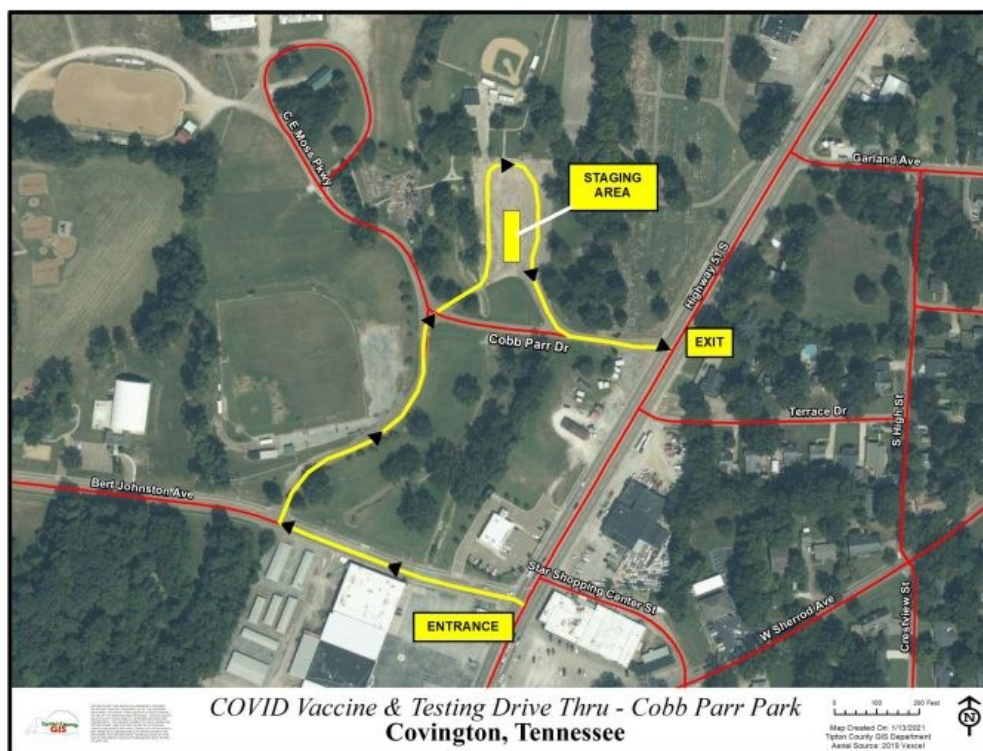

Gov. Lee Announces ‘No Further Restrictions’ on K-12 Sporting Events Starting February 1st

Gov. Lee Statement on Lifting Additional School Sports Restrictions

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Today, Tennessee Governor Bill Lee released the following statement in coordination with his [video announcement](#):

“Tennessee's COVID-19 numbers continue to rapidly improve with almost a 60% decline in cases and nearly a 40% decline in hospitalizations because of the efforts of Tennesseans to wear masks, wash hands and limit gatherings. When case counts were at their highest, we placed temporary, targeted restrictions on indoor school sporting events. The data now reflects rapidly falling numbers and because of that data, we are ending the recent additional restrictions around who can participate in or attend indoor school sporting events. The guidance and rules of local education agencies and the TSSAA remain in place, but Executive Order 74 will be suspended effective Monday, February 1. I encourage Tennesseans to keep up their responsible personal choices as we work towards a COVID-free Tennessee.”
