As you may have heard by now, the novel Coronavirus has made its way to Tennessee. Governor Bill Lee confirmed Thursday morning, March 5, 2020, that a 44-year old man in Williamson County tested positive for COVID-19 (scientific name for this coronavirus). According to doctors the patient had not traveled internationally, but he had recently traveled, roundtrip, between Nashville and Boston, Massachusetts. Governor Lee announced that Tennessee was the first of five states to test for COVID-19 and testing will continue in our state. The Tennessee Department of Health released more information today on this first case of the virus in Tennessee. You can find that information [here](#).

While this virus poses a serious public health risk, especially to those who are already vulnerable with underlying health conditions, this is not a time to panic. As the adage goes “An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.” I simply want to share information with our citizens, so you are informed and prepared. All indications from medical and healthcare professionals is that the overall risk to the general public is low. This is the time to prepare and educate yourself on the symptoms of COVID-19, what to do if you feel sick, and the best ways to prevent infection. This is especially true if you or anyone in your household has recently traveled outside our community to areas where there are confirmed cases of the Coronavirus. I encourage you to visit the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website [here](#). The Tennessee Department of Health has also established a Tennessee Coronavirus Public Information Hotline, which is available every day from 10:00am to 10:00pm. The number for the hotline is 1-877-857-2945. Those individuals who may not have internet access may call the hotline for information.

Common sense is key, folks! Wash your hands regularly with soap and water. If you are feeling sick, stay at home if you are able and stay away from others who are especially vulnerable. If you are feeling sick and must go out in public, keep your distance from others and cover your mouth when coughing or sneezing. If you have symptoms and are seeking medical attention call your doctor or healthcare provider ahead so that they can take appropriate safety measures. Perhaps most importantly, stay updated on the situation with information from reputable sources. The Centers for Disease Control and Tennessee Department of Health (TN.gov/health) are excellent resources. Rumors, conspiracy theories and other misinformation that tend to spread on social media during times of uncertainty are dangerous.

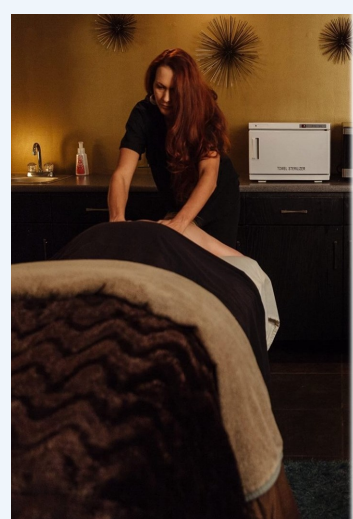

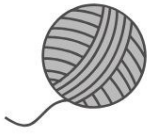

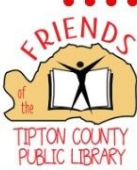

Notice Covington Utilities Customers

The City of Covington is in the process of installing AMI (Advanced Metering Infrastructure) to replace its aging water and gas meters. Phase II will begin after all material has been ordered and shipped. Installation will require a very short interruption of service for each customer. Dyersburg State Changes Operational Plans for March 13 – April 3 Amidst COVID-19 Concerns

Dyersburg, Tennessee - In an effort to address the COVID-19 pandemic and growing concern for the health and safety of students, faculty and staff, Dyersburg State Community College (DSCC) will extend spring break for students through March 22. All in-person lecture courses are scheduled to transition to an online format beginning March 23 through April 3.

While no known cases of COVID-19 have been reported at any of the DSCC locations, the College will continue to monitor the situation and provide updates through a dedicated webpage at <https://www.dsc.edu/coronavirus>.
