Public Works / Utilities Report – Director David Gray

Update on MEAC (Municipal Energy Acquisition Corporation) gas contract

- Submitted first invoice and explained costs, discounts, and fees
- 30-year contract, guaranteed cost for 5 years
- Submitted letter from CenterPoint Energy. Selling to Energy Capital Partners. No changes expected other than payment address

Update on residential and commercial sanitation pickup

- Discussed Republic contract
- Republic conducted audit to determine # of rollouts vs. what is billed
- 3,120 being billed. We counted 3,939. 102 carts were not being paid for. Result is 3,837 which is additional 717.
- Email from Jerry Burke. Will conduct another audit, apologized for confusion. Hopefully audit will be done in next couple weeks.
- Director Gray does not feel that they will try and retro the underpayment
- Director Gray will bring new audit to this committee when it is complete

Camera Security for Wastewater Treatment Plant and Shop

Tuxedo Drive drainage

- Codes Department will send out a letter informing property owners they are required to purchase the culverts
- Citizen Mr. Simonton inquired about the system and whether it would be sufficient to carry the amount of water. Director Gray stated that it would be sufficient.
- Alderman Sullivan asked about trees that need to be removed. Director Gray stated that it would be the property owner's decision.

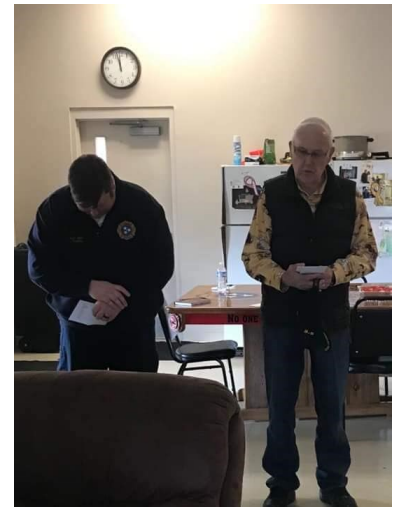

As you may have heard by now, the novel Coronavirus has made its way to Tennessee. Governor Bill Lee confirmed Thursday morning, March 5, 2020, that a 44-year old man in Williamson County tested positive for COVID-19 (scientific name for this coronavirus). According to doctors the patient had not traveled internationally, but he had recently traveled, roundtrip, between Nashville and Boston, Massachusetts. Governor Lee announced that Tennessee was the first of five states to test for COVID-19 and testing will continue in our state. The Tennessee Department of Health released more information today on this first case of the virus in Tennessee. You can find that information [here](#).

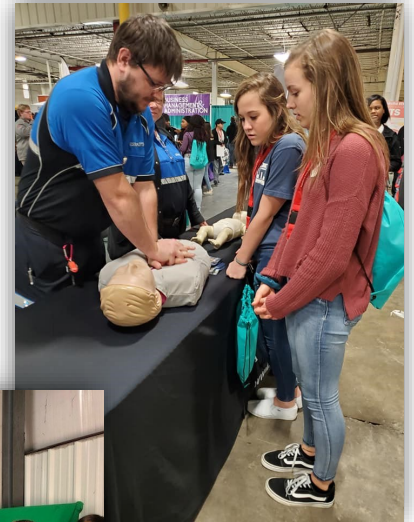
While this virus poses a serious public health risk, especially to those who are already vulnerable with underlying health conditions, this is not a time to panic. As the adage goes “An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.” I simply want to share information with our citizens, so you are informed and prepared. All indications from medical and healthcare professionals is that the overall risk to the general public is low. This is the time to prepare and educate yourself on the symptoms of COVID-19, what to do if you feel sick, and the best ways to prevent infection. This is especially true if you or anyone in your household has recently traveled outside our community to areas where there are confirmed cases of the Coronavirus. I encourage you to visit the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website [here](#). The Tennessee Department of Health has also established a Tennessee Coronavirus Public Information Hotline, which is available every day from 10:00am to 10:00pm. The number for the hotline is 1-877-857-2945. Those individuals who may not have internet access may call the hotline for information.

Common sense is key, folks! Wash your hands regularly with soap and water. If you are feeling sick, stay at home if you are able and stay away from others who are especially vulnerable. If you are feeling sick and must go out in public, keep your distance from others and cover your mouth when coughing or sneezing. If you have symptoms and are seeking medical attention call your doctor or healthcare provider ahead so that they can take appropriate safety measures. Perhaps most importantly, stay updated on the situation with information from reputable sources. The Centers for Disease Control and Tennessee Department of Health (TN.gov/health) are excellent resources. Rumors, conspiracy theories and other misinformation that tend to spread on social media during times of uncertainty are dangerous.
