### Projects:

- 1. Security Fencing: Design & Bid (TAD #85-555-0148-23)**
  - \$53,500 – 100% federally funded
  - 30% Design Review Meeting – 11/8/2022
  - 90% Design Review Meeting – 12/7/2022
  - IFB Plans / Advertisement for Bids – 12/14/2022
  - Pre-Bid Conference – 1/10/2023
  - Bid Opening – 1/16/2023
  - Request for Construction Funding – 1/18/2023
- 2. Security Fencing: Construction (TAD #85-555-014X-23)**
  - Construction Cost Estimate: \$361,200 – 100% federal funding to be *requested*
    - 5% local match will likely be necessary
  - Funding Request to be submitted January 18, 2023
  - Construction NTP anticipated March 2023
- 3. Airport Layout Plan (ALP) Update + AGIS Survey (TAD #85-555-0147-22)**
  - 2-year master planning project that is required to prepare for runway rehabilitation in FY25
  - Kick-off Meeting held with TDOT – 8/2/2022
  - Forecast Chapter & Exhibit “A” to TDOT 1/5/2023
  - 30% Review Meeting: TBD

### Grants / Other Updates:

- 1. Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill – Airport Terminals Program (FY2023)**
  - *Competitive* grant opportunity to “upgrade, modernize, and rebuild our nation’s airport terminals and airport-owned Airport Traffic Control Towers (ATCTs).
  - 95% Federal / 5% Local Match
  - Scope developed for rehabilitation of Covington terminal building
  - Estimate of Probable Construction Costs developed for proposed scope – **\$555,800**
  - Application for funding submitted: October 24, 2022
  - FAA reviewing applications
- 2. Instrument Flight Procedure (IFP) for Runway 19**
  - FAA has reviewed current conditions and confirmed eligibility for IFP as of 5/3/22
  - IFP will allow for operations under a wider array of weather conditions and is expected to increase aeronautical activity on the airfield
  - Publication of new IFP is expected to take 12 to 18 months due to FAA backlog

- ALP Update project will incorporate IFP into new master plan
- FAA currently reviewing request as of 12/20/22 – awaiting AGIS Survey upload to FAA Database
  - This task is ongoing under the ALP Update project

**3. *Bipartisan Infrastructure Law – Airport Infrastructure (\$145,000 per year)***

- FAA announce on 12/16/21 – M04 to receive \$145,000 in additional funding for FY23 to be used in conjunction with the standard \$150,000 non-primary entitlement (NPE) funds.
- The additional funding will continue through FY25—however, funding amounts may vary from year to year.
- Grant guidelines and eligible project will match those of the standard NPE grants.

**4. *2023 Airfield Maintenance – TAD # 84-555-0794-23***

- \$15,000 Annual reimbursable grant for maintenance and upkeep

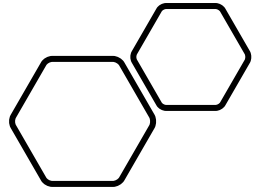
# Aquatic Center Happenings

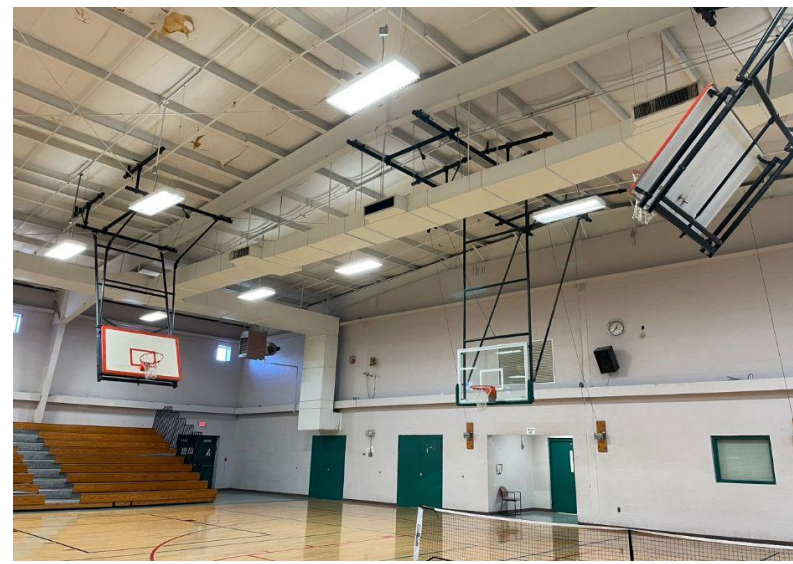
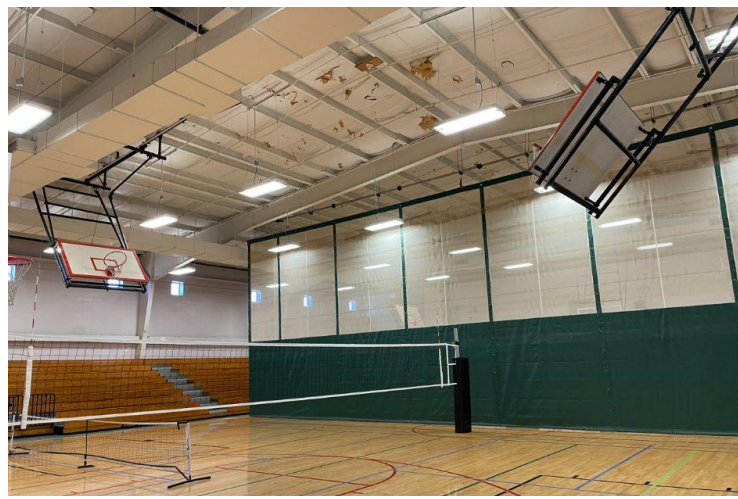
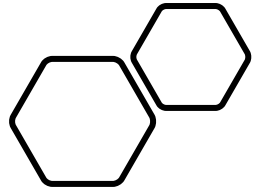

This will set basketball season back 2 weeks.

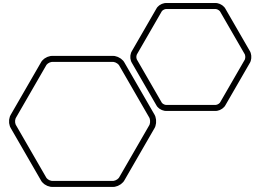
