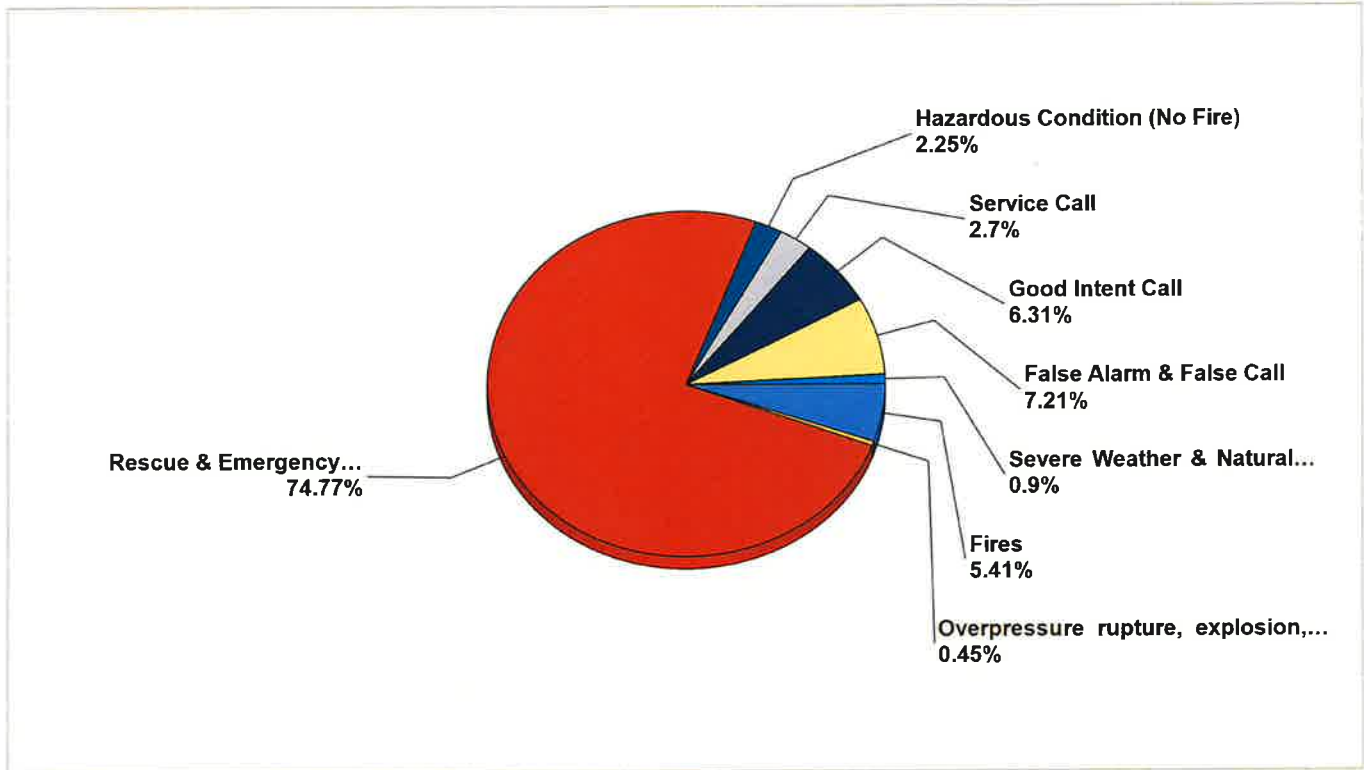

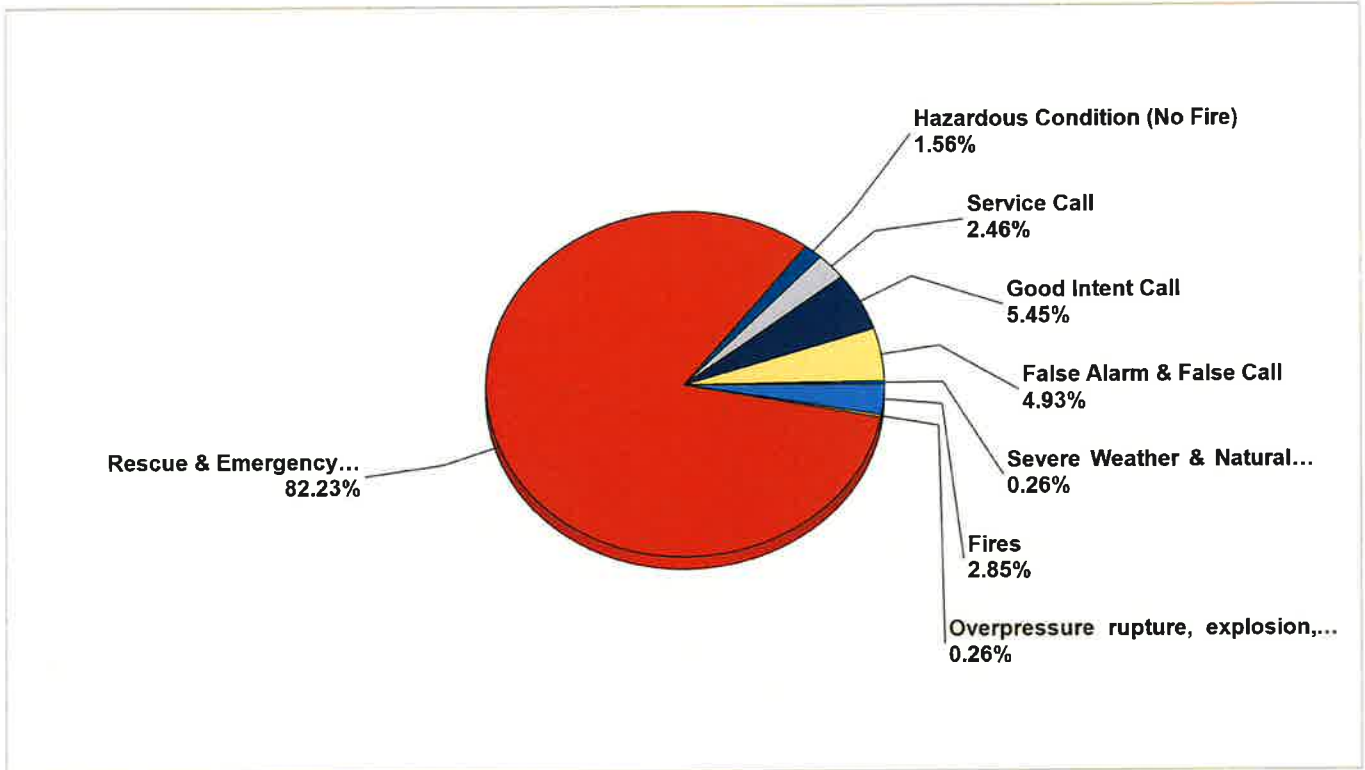

Residential break-in call results in multiple drug charges and weapon being recovered. Defendant appears in court this week.

On 02/05/2023 at about 11:30 pm, Covington Police Department officers responded to a break-in call in progress at **Sunrise Apartments in the 1100 block of Simonton St.** in Covington. The complainant who was home with her three (3) young children reported to E911 Dispatch there was somebody kicking, hitting, and yelling at her door attempting to gain entry. Officers arrived and observed a male suspect, later identified as **Thazer Currie, 36, of Peeler Road in Covington**, standing at the complainant's door. Officers observed Currie to have an open beer in his hand and he appeared to be under the influence. CPD officers were assisted at the scene by Tipton County Sheriff's Office deputies due to the burglary in progress initial call.

Officers began to conduct a pat down of Currie who was discovered to have a firearm in his coat pocket. The loaded 357 Revolver handgun was collected as evidence during the search. Officers located approximately 23.1 grams of Marijuana from the same coat pocket where the firearm was retrieved. Deputies located two (2) small plastic baggies, one containing 30 ecstasy pills and 2 grams of a white powdery substance consistent with cocaine in the other coat pocket. While officers were retrieving the cocaine and ecstasy, the baggie of alleged cocaine fell out of Currie's pocket and Currie placed his left foot over the bag of cocaine and attempted to destroy the evidence by stomping it. Officers removed Currie away from the cocaine to prevent him from destroying the evidence. Currie was placed into custody. The drugs were collected as evidence for testing at the TBI crime laboratory. Officers confirmed that Currie is a convicted felon.

Officers confirmed the complainant and Currie had broken up recently prior to this incident and requested he be removed from her property. Thazer Currie was arrested and charged with Possession of Schedule I with Intent, Possession of Schedule VI with Intent, Possession of

Schedule II with Intent, Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Dangerous Felony, Public Intoxication, Tampering with Evidence, and Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon. Currie was transported to the Tipton County Sheriff's Office jail and slated to appear in Tipton County General Sessions Court today, 10 March 2023. He remains free on a \$10,000 bond.

"This is an example of great teamwork, and the results were, the suspect was stopped before entering the residence and the victim and her children were unharmed. Officers and deputies recovered illegal drugs and a weapon which were removed from the community. A thank you to Sheriff Beasley and his staff for the assistance during the incident. Great police work!" said Chief Donna Turner

On 02 March 2023 at 7:40 PM, Covington Police Department Officers responded to a possible robbery and stabbing at the parking lot of 526 Hwy 51 (C-Town Market). Officers upon arrival did not locate a victim initially but the clerk indicated the victim left southbound on Highway 51 in Covington on foot. Officers located **Diaquan Williams, 29, of Memphis, TN** walking in front of 510 Highway 51 (Bull Market) and observed a small circular puncture wound above Williams' left shoulder blade. Williams stated that while walking home from work, two males approached him from behind and tried to rob him on a street near C-Town.

Williams provided specific descriptions of the suspects as: a younger skinny male (unknown clothing description) and the other was an older heavy-set male with an afro and beard (wearing a blue hoodie, black joggers with green stripes down the sides, and black shoes). According to Williams the older male called out to him then both males attacked him. They grabbed his pant pockets and hoodie but did not get any of William's belongings. Williams indicated he was able to get both of his hoodies off when the older male stabbed him with an unknown object as he was fleeing. Williams stated he ran inside C-Town and waited until they were gone. Williams stated he went back to the location the incident occurred and retrieved his hoodies and personal items including his wallet.

Detectives responded to investigate the incident and EMS responded to the scene, but Williams refused to be transported and was treated on scene. Detectives returned to C-Town and the clerk was unaware of the incident and assisted in providing the security footage. Detectives interviewed Williams who indicated the incident occurred at the intersection of North Tipton and East Ripley Street after he left work at Cold Storage at Unilever in Covington.

Detectives discovered that Williams did not work for Cold Storage and was actually employed by Randstad and working in east Memphis. Upon review of the video surveillance at C-Town Market, the victim was observed walking casually into the store and purchased an energy drink. Williams walks close to the camera, and it is observed that there are no injuries to his back at that time. Williams was also observed to be in a blue shirt with no hoodie. After Williams leaves C-Town, he is seen casually walking down Highway 51 South until he was located by officers at Bull Market

parking lot. The investigation confirmed, through the assistance of the witnesses located in the area and at the businesses, that Diaquan William's report of the incident was inconsistent with the facts gathered. Detectives have charged Williams with **Filing a False Report** in Tipton County General Sessions Court. Detectives are working closely with Shelby County authorities to locate Williams and serve the arrest warrant in this case.

"This is a great example of how when witnesses are cooperative with detectives the facts can be revealed in cases. I appreciate these witnesses stepping up and doing the right thing for the right reasons." said Chief Donna Turner "I appreciate the CPD officers and detectives who worked tirelessly to "get it right" unveiling the false allegations against these men."

Today, Covington Police Department officers make two (2) arrests for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm as a result of an armed party complaint.

On 17 March 2023 at about 3:20 PM the staff at **First Heritage Credit** located at 105 Mueller Brass Road in Covington observed three (3) males acting suspicious and which were passing around a handgun on the parking lot and then one of the men concealed the handgun. The staff secured the business and provided a clothing description of the suspects who left walking toward Highway 51. Officers were dispatched to the armed party complaint and responded to the area and within moments located the suspects on the Walmart parking Lot.

Officers identified the men as: **Keyshawn Adams, 23, of Price Street in Covington, Markavis Tre'Shaun Morton, 22, of Tipton Village Apartments located on Old Brighton Road in Covington, and Robert Currie, Jr., 24, of Junius Lee Road in Ripley.** Officers recovered a loaded Kel-Tec firearm on Adams which was collected as evidence. The men were transported to the Criminal Investigations Division (CID) to be interviewed regarding the incident.

The men were cooperative during the investigation and detectives contacted witnesses and confirmed the men had no intention of robbing the credit union. The investigation revealed that the weapon was passed from Currie Jr to Adams, and they were unaware the staff could see them passing the weapon. Morton was released without charges.

Keyshawn Adams was charged with Unlawful Possession of a Firearm. In addition, detectives confirmed he was on Tipton County Probation for a previous Domestic Violence conviction and remains in custody at the Tipton County Jail awaiting his appearance in Tipton County General Sessions Court.

Robert Currie Jr was charged with Unlaw Possession of a Firearm. In addition, detectives confirmed he was currently out on bond for a prior Domestic Violence charge. Currie Jr remains in Tipton County jail with a \$10,000.00 bond awaiting his court appearance.

"The staff at First Heritage Credit did what we ask all citizens to do, if you see something suspicious, call and report it to law enforcement. The officers responded quickly and located the men and recovered the firearm, removing it from the community," said Chief Donna Turner "The

men charged in this case could not lawfully be in possession of a firearm with the Domestic Violence related charges in their history as directed by the Judge.”

Covington Police Department is asking for assistance in identifying suspects in an overnight Pharmacy burglary in Covington, Tn.

On 22 March 2023 at about 2:30 AM, CPD Officers responded to **1500 Hwy 51 South**, the **Bradford Pharmacy**, on an alarm call. Upon arrival it was observed that the front door to the business had been pried open at the lock. Officers entered the building and did not observe any further damage or locate anyone in the business. Detectives in the Criminal Investigation Division responded and began processing the crime scene and gathering evidence in the burglary.

Management arrived on scene and provided access to the video system, which revealed a **white**, newer model, **Toyota Camry Hybrid** pull into the main entrance at 2:29 AM. The white car then backs into a parking space and detectives confirmed it to be missing a license plate. **Two male suspects** exit the car with crow bars in their hands and begin to break open the front door. Both suspects enter the business and began taking several items from behind the counter.

It was determined that among the items taken were bottles of Promethazine DM Syrup, bottles of regular Promethazine, and a bag of chips. Promethazine is primarily targeted for its use in the street drug "Lean", where it is combined with codeine, and mixed with sprite. The male suspects quickly leave the business at 2:33 am after the alarms sounds and were observed to travel northbound on Highway 51.

Further review of interior cameras revealed that both suspects wore partial face coverings with cold weather gloves. One suspect was observed to be a tall heavy-set male with red Nike shoes, while the other was a shorter, thin male wearing white shoes and a yellow safety vest. Within an hour it was reported that Brownsville Police Department was investigating a pharmacy burglary with the same suspects and vehicle description, where Promethazine was also stolen. During the investigation, detectives confirmed a similar overnight pharmacy burglary in Ripley with the same suspect descriptions and vehicle.

"The suspects were in and out of the pharmacy in less than 5 minutes." said Chief Donna Turner "The Pharmacy staff are working closely with Detectives, and we are following up on leads in the case. We are asking for anyone who may recognize the suspects or the vehicle to contact us. Detectives are joining resources with Ripley and Brownsville to try and identify these men."
