1. Fleet:

• After researching the cost comparison between a used or new vehicle to replace the vehicle totaled from the December wreck, the cost of a quality used vehicle would be in the low to mid \$20,000 range. After checking the state bid, we located a 2021 Dodge Charger for \$25,300 and felt the new vehicle's purchase was a better option. The fund to purchase this vehicle was a combination of insurance proceeds from the wrecked vehicle, General Funds, and \$5,000 from Narcotics funds.

2. Personnel:

- Two (2) certified officers were given conditional offers, and we are in the process of reviewing and interviewing non-certified applicants to fill the remaining positions.
- We have one officer at TLETA with a graduate on March 26, 2021, and one (1) officer scheduled to start TLETA on March 29, 2021.
- MPD has advised that they will hold a basic class beginning sometime in April, and we intend to send the officers we are interviewing now to this basic class.
- We terminated a probationary officer on February 19, 2021, for excessive absenteeism. Law enforcement is an essential service, and dependability is an imperative characteristic of any officer. Reliability is a crucial characteristic of a quality law enforcement officer and is vital in ensuring proper law enforcement coverage and safety for our citizens and fellow officers.

3. Training:

- Two (2) officers attended a three (3) day school in Nashville on De-escalation strategies and techniques.
- Three (3) officers attended a three (3) day Standard Field Sobriety Techniques Training (SFST) in Waynesboro, Tennessee.
- Two (2) officers will be attending a four (4) day Critical Incident Response Peer Support training class at Cumberland Furnace, Tennessee. I will elaborate more in the meeting.

4. Weather:

- There were no significant events that the PD had to deal with during the winter weather event of recent days. We had adequate coverage and were able to respond as needed. The new trucks that we added to the fleet proved invaluable.
- We worked two (2) crashes from February 14 20, 2021.

5. Calls for Service:

• We had a total of **892** calls for service for the month of January 2021.




